Baseera introduced, for the first time in Egypt with

work on providing special training for their surrounding communities; we have classified three main target groups for our training program; parents, school teachers and health professionals. We provide specific know-how and skills for each target group in dealing with people with visual impairment. This training program is especially important because of the lack of knowledge about the special needs of people with visual impairment and how it differs from other disabilities.
